

# KIRKBYMOORSIDE SCHOOL NEWSLETTER

Class	This week we have	Next week
Wrens	We have been reading 'Real Superheroes' and talking about what we would like to be when we grow up. The poem we will be learning is 'Furry, Furry Squirrel'. In maths we have been introducing number 5 and counting out 5 objects. We have continued to link the correct number of objects to match numerals up to 5.	Wrens will be reading 'Mr wolf's Pancakes' and discuss ing our favourite pancake toppings. The poem we will be learning is 'Pancakes'. In maths we will be revisiting number 5 and exploring how it can be made in different ways using a combination of objects.
Robins	This week robins have explored the story 'On the Way Home' by Jill Murphy. We have considered if and when we should tell the truth. We have also been making up a story that isn't true. In maths we have been developing our growing confidence in pairs that make 5. We have also explored how to make 6 and 7 and know that 6 is 1 more than 5 and 7 is 2 more than 5.	During our first week back we will be introducing our new topic 'Growing'. We will start by exploring the bod' Meesha Makes Friends'. In maths we will be exploring when an amount is equal or not equal and how we can manipulate sets of objects to make them equal. We will be using the language 'more than', 'fewer than' and 'equal to'. We will be thinking about how everyone is special and unique and different to each other. We will be thinking about what makes a good friend and how we can all be good friends.
Wood- peckers and Kingfish- ers	This week we have continued with our narrative based on the story Leaf. We have been focusing on editing our writing, focusing on interesting adjectives and adding detail to writing. We have been looking at Judaism in RE, the Star of David, Jewish beliefs about God and learning a short prayer. In ICT we have continued our work with robots getting them to follow our given commands.	We will be focusing on diversity on the first week back. We are going to be looking at the book 'The Barnabus Project' which is all about abnormal animals who are being thrown away for being different. We will touch the subjects of respect, being different and being an invidual.
Puffins and Gannets	Puffins and Gannets have been looking at how characters are portrayed in Edward Tulane and been writing our diary extracts. In maths, Puffins have been focusing on measure in centimetres and meters. In science, both groups have been learning how to draw simple circuits using the correct symbols. In PSHE, both year groups have been looking at moving.	Gannets will be continuing to look at length and perime ter with a focus on the perimeter of rectilinear shapes and polygons. In English, we will be editing, improving and then publishing the final version of our diary entry. Our new book will be a A Dollop of Ghee and a Pot of Wisdom. In Science, we will be completing our electric ty topic by exploring the role of switches in a series circuit before making our own switches and reporting on our findings.
Falcons and Os- preys	This week, year 5 and 6 have concluded reading 'Race to the Frozen North' as we learn about Matthew Henson's expeditions to the Arctic. In writing, year 5 have completed our recount writing about the planetarium visit and year 6 have deepened their understanding around sentence structures, based around the 'Titanium' video. In topic we have concluded our learning on Arctic and Antarctic explorers, created fact files and we have been concluding our topic in science on Earth and Space by looking at different phases of the moon. In maths, year 5 have begun the topic on fractions by multiplying fractions by integers and year 6 have continued their journey into investigating	After half term, Year 5 and 6 will continue our learning on Explorers and will turn to looking at mountainous explorers. We will be starting our topic with looking at Nepal and creating Nepalese dishes whilst writing instructions in English. This also feeds into our Global Curiculum topic of Culteral Diversity which will run throughout our lessons throughout the first week. Our Science topic will be forces and we will begin by looking at the different types of push and pull forces as well as gravity. In maths, Year 5 will continue their work on fractions, moving from multiplying fractions to finding fractions of amounts. Year 6 will begin their learning journey on algebra.
